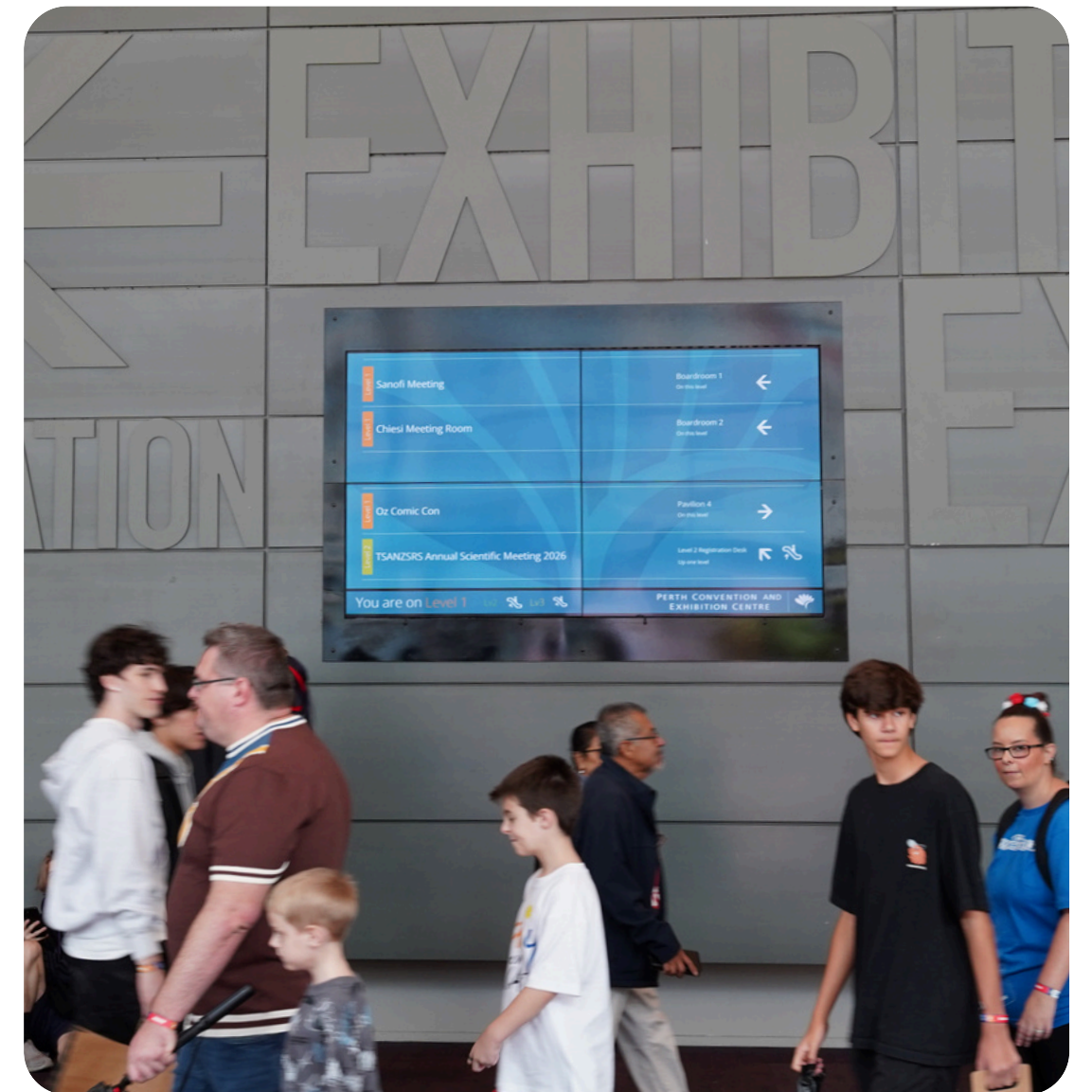
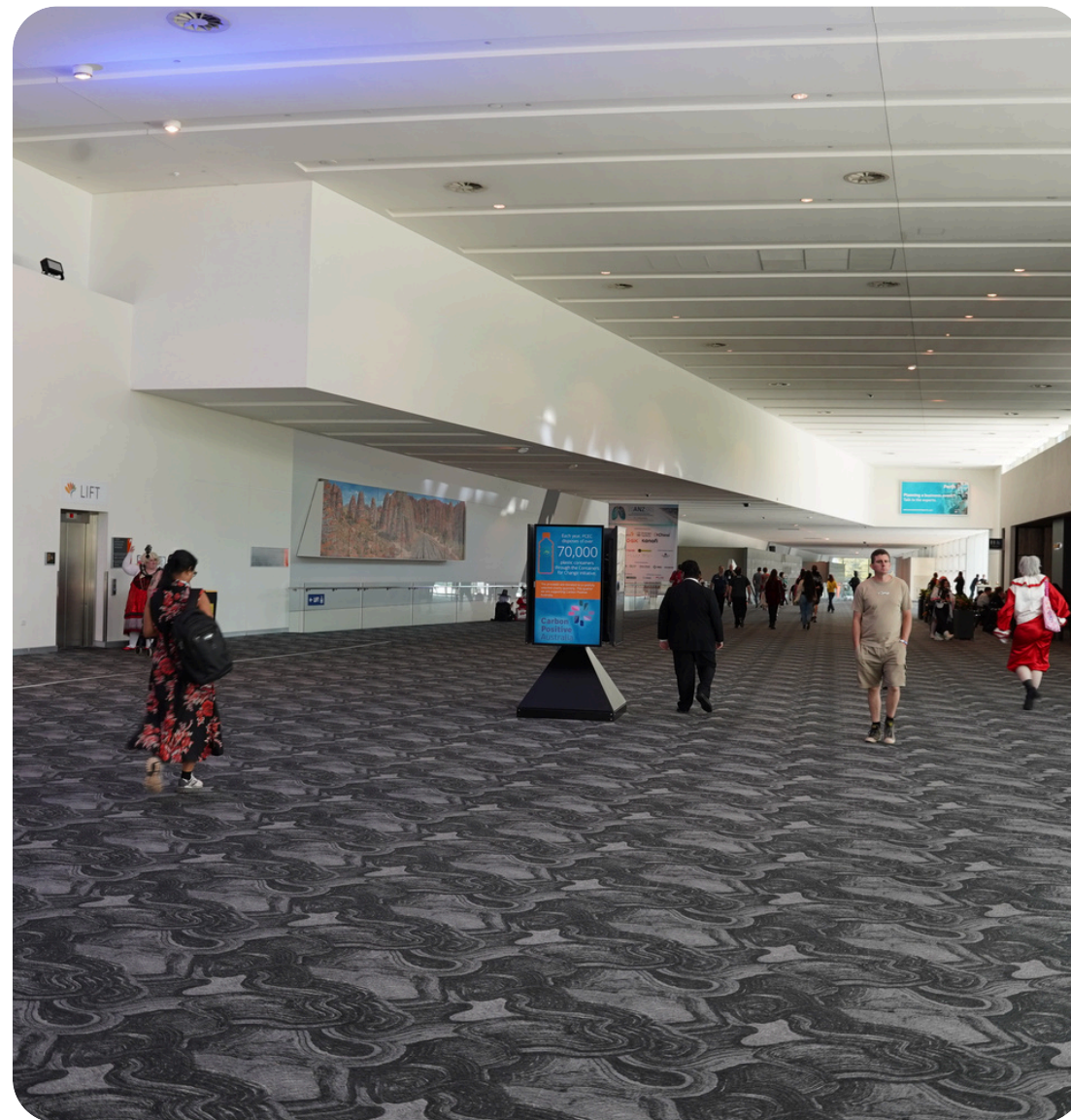

There are stairs, escalators, and a lift to each floor.



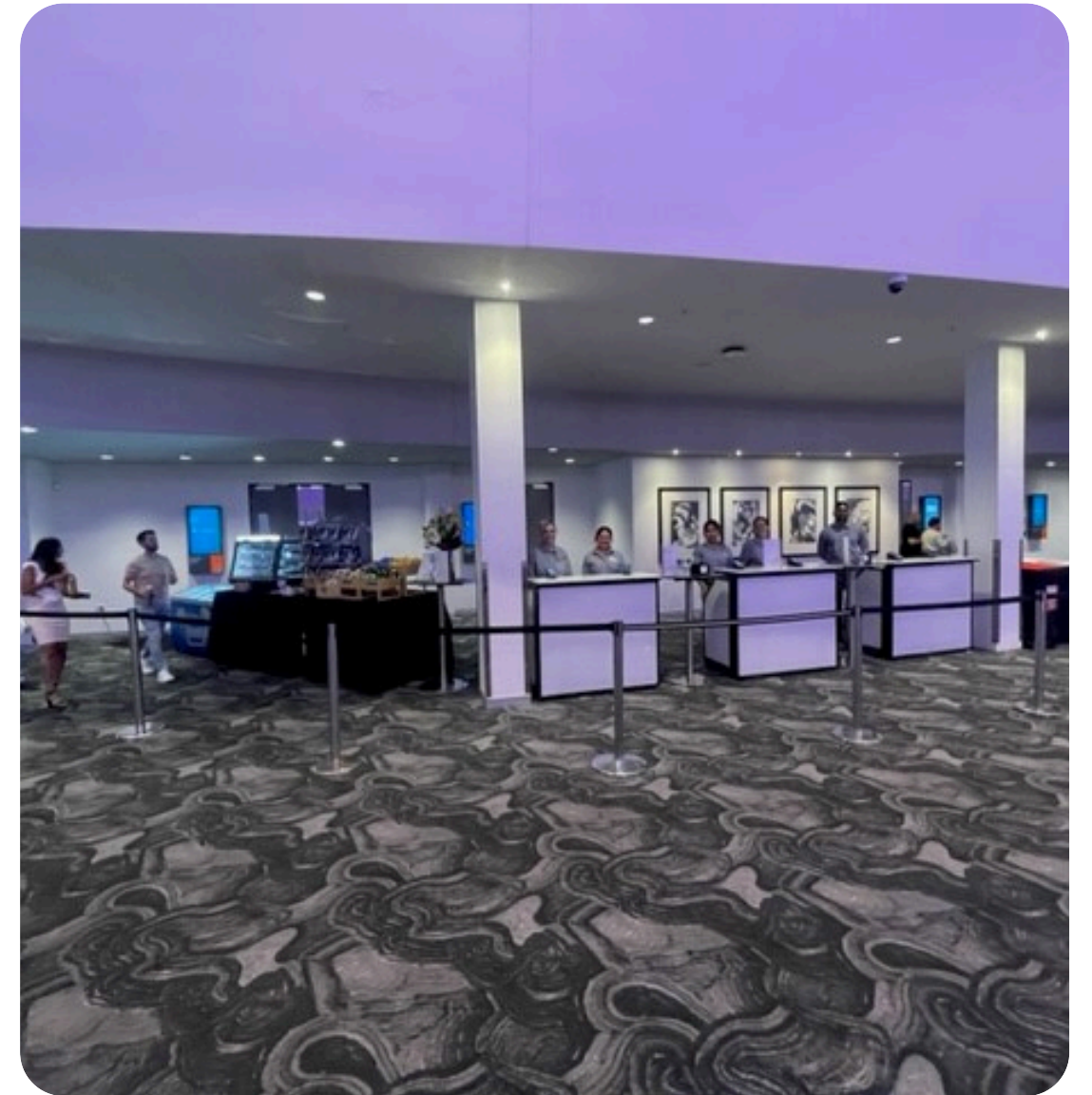
I will wait for my turn to confirm my ticket at the door.
